Jorge R. Oksenberg holds the G.A. Zimmermann Endowed Chair in Neurology and is Professor of Neurology at the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF), with secondary appointments with the UCSF Institute of Human Genetics and Weill Neuroscience Institute. A native from Argentina, Dr. Oksenberg received his PhD in Immunology in 1987 from the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, Israel, and joined the UCSF faculty in 1993 following postdoctoral training at Stanford University, California. His research interests include neurogenetics, the biology of aging, and the regulation of the immune response, working primarily in multiple sclerosis and experimental autoimmune demyelination. The US National Institute of Health and the US National MS Society have consistently supported his work for the last 25 years, resulting in over 200 peer-reviewed published articles. Dr. Oksenberg served in numerous advisory panels and study sections, and he is a founder member of the Strategy Group for the International Multiple Sclerosis Genetics Consortium.
